Kingsley & Drexel Improvements Construction Update #19 October 21, 2016

- Unfortunately, there was a bit of delay on the sidewalk work that was originally scheduled to occur this week. The sidewalk work will now occur the week of October 25th, and with cooperative weather (and barring any unforeseen circumstances) all sidewalks should be in poured by the end of the week. The Contractor will be framing and pouring the sidewalks on south side of Kingsley first, then moving to the north side of Drexel. For those of you with sidewalks across the driveways, the Contractor will notify you the day before the sidewalk work occurs across your driveway so that you have a chance to move your vehicle. Once poured, the sidewalk typically needs 3-5 days to cure to a sufficient strength to support vehicular traffic, and therefore you will not have vehicular access to your driveway during this time, but the concrete will be strong enough for the trick-or-treaters to walk upon on come Halloween.
- The Contractor will work on sidewalk/driveway removals on the north side of Kingsley. Again, during the removal process, there will be a short period of time (30 minutes +/-) where your driveway will not be accessible. The Contractor will place a temporary stone driving surface to provide access until the forms are set for the concrete pour.
- The Contractor will continue to shape driveways for paving. This work is scheduled to begin mid to late week, and the Contractor will work on the driveways on the south side of Drexel first. If all goes well, the Contractor has indicated that they may pave the driveways on the south side of Drexel at week's end.
- The Contractor will be rough grading the south side of Drexel in preparation for final restoration.
